It was 'just the flu'. Or so Tara thought. A few weeks later, she'd lost her right leg and very nearly her life. But despite everything, Tara feels 'lucky' — lucky to be alive and to have been blessed with your kindness when it mattered most...

t was in the back of the ambulance on the way to the Mater that Tara suffered her first of *eight* cardiac arrests.

She doesn't remember much after that...

Tara had 'myocarditis' — an inflammation of the heart. And she went downhill fast with double pneumonia, organ failure and sepsis. Tara was so ill she was placed on an ECMO machine to take over her heart and lung function.

Her family were called in to say their final goodbyes to Tara.

Tara wanted to share this special moment with you, and to thank you for helping to bring her 'back from the brink.'



he Mater cared for hundreds of injured soldiers during the revolutionary wars, but by 1923 it faced financial collapse. By then, our doors had been open 62 years. But in her hour of need, it was the people of Ireland who rallied to save their beloved hospital.


A 'monster carnival' kicked off the fundraising efforts—sweepstakes,

A few Minutes with the Mater's Mental Health Team...

he team at the Mater's St Aloysius Ward care for people with some of the most severe mental health issues in the whole of Ireland — patients suffering from severe depression, schizophrenia and psychosis.

"We have a lot of patients that would have been in institutional care, either as a child or even as an adult," says mental health nurse, Aideen Kelly. "So we try to create an environment as different as possible to that — homely and comfortable with sofas rather than hard waitingroom style chairs.

And that's especially helpful for nurses. "Being able to sit next to your patient on a sofa — somewhere comfortable, not clinical. It helps when they're distressed. It's sensory. When you're comfortable, you feel calmer, don't you?"

Understanding of mental health issues has come a long way. But still today, people face stigma.

Aideen and the team are grateful beyond words for the understanding and compassion you show for their patients. Thank you!
